HISTORY AND TRADITION

Rich in tradition yet oriented towards future...

VTMNSS College, Dhanuvachapuram has a glorious past and its cultural heritage ennobles and enlivens our day-to-day life. The splendid building is a memoir of a bygone age which acknowledged an ardent group of students and faculty members, who like those at present questioned outdated theories, evaluated current issues and envisaged a bright future. History doesn't anchor here, but it leads us towards a goal visualized by a strong and committed legend, Bharatha Kesari Padmabhushan Mannathu Padmanabhan who pursued a noble endeavour to democratize the horizons of education during turbulent times.

The college was established by the Nair Service Society in 1964 in order to cherish the ever-loving memory of the great freedom fighter, Thalakulathu Velu Thampi Dalawa, on his 200th Birth Anniversary. Mannathu Padmanabhan, with his remarkable foresight, has painted the canvas of education in Kerala by initiating steps for opening up a number of colleges across the state. Without his twin qualities of genius and philanthropy all those achievements made hitherto would not have been possible. He still inspires the college's dedicated learning community, in furthering exploration, discovery and creativity.

Located in a lush green environment, the campus covers an area of 20 Acres on a hillock at Dhanuvachapuram, a place of historical significance enroute Kanyakumari on the southernmost part of Kerala. The sylvan surroundings in which the college is situated is conducive to a peaceful academic atmosphere. An institution rich in tradition yet oriented towards future.

The college started its journey of academic exploration as a junior college on 15th July 1964 in a temporary building and was upgraded in 1967 with the launching of Degree Courses in English, History, Political Science, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and Commerce. Degree courses in Economics and Botany were started in 1981 and Zoology and Malayalam were introduced in the year 1984 and 1995 respectively. The introduction of the Post Graduate course in Commerce in the year 1981 upgraded the institution to a First Grade College. The Post Graduate Course in English was started during 1998-99 and History during 1999-2000. The P.G. Course in Economics was started in 2013. The College

was first accredited by NAAC at B+ level in 2003 and was reacredited with CGPA 2.74 with B Grade in 2012 and with CGPA 2.71 with B+ Grade in 2018.

MANAGEMENT

The Nair Service Society, a synonym for selfless service and social commitment was founded by the late Bharatha Kesari Mannathu Padmanabhan on 31st October 1914. It came into being at a crucial stage in the history of the Nair community which was facing a crisis brought about by disunity and blind adherence to outdated customs, beliefs and practices. Even though they had a glorious past, the ignorance accumulated over centuries, reinforced by inadequate education, which proved disastrous for the community. Their predilection for celebrations and a penchant for ceremonial occasions fuelled by a strong affinity towards profligacy and extravaganza, contributed to their decline and downfall. Gradual loss of land holdings and unemployment due to lack of modern education completed the process of disintegration. It was at this juncture that Mannathu Padmanabhan took the initiative to unite the members of the Nair community and build up a great organization.

The rest is history. He inspired them and gave them a dream, a dream of liberation from poverty, misery and ignorance. In his own unique way, with his persistence, tireless efforts, vision and farsightedness, the NSS opened an array of educational institutions, hospitals and other socially beneficial institutions all over the state. With an amazing network of units at the village (Karayoga) and taluk levels (Taluk Unions), the NSS has evolved into a well-knit and coherent organization that has never swerved from the noble ideals and high principles of the Founder. The NSS runs more than hundred schools, 16 arts and science colleges, three training colleges, a homoeo medical college, an engineering college, several nursing colleges, Polytechnic college, TTC schools, working womens hostels and technical institutions. In july 2012 NSS established an academy of Civil Services with a view to moulding the youth to guide the destiny of the Nation called NSS Academy of Civil Services (NACS).

ACADEMIC REGULATIONS FIRST DEGREE PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

Semester

Semester means a term consisting of 90 working days distributed over a minimum period of 18 week.

Course

Course means a portion of a subject to be taught and evaluated in a semester. It is similar to the paper in annual system.

Language course

Students who join for any under graduate programme have to study English as the first language and an additional language. The additional languages offered by our institution are Malayalam, Hindi, Sanskrit and Tamil.

Foundation Course

Foundation Course means a Course at the foundation level that all students of the First Degree Programme have to register. For under graduate programme, there is two foundation courses. For B.A/B.Sc., one course under language and other under under core. For B.Com. both the foundation courses included under the core.

Core Course

Core course means compulsory course in a main subject related to the First Degree Programme (FDP) in a discipline. Students who join for B.A/B.Sc. programmes have to study compulsory 12-15 course courses and for B.Com. programme a student has to attempt 16 core courses. In both, students should submit one dissertation work, followed by a viva voce examination.

Complementary Courses

Complementary course means a course in a subject other than the major subject and is complementary to the main subject. Students who join for B.A/B.Sc. programmes have to study 8-10 complementary courses while for B.Com. programme a student has to choose 4 complementary courses.

Open/Elective Course

Open course means an optional course which the student is free to take at his/her will during the fifth semester. It is offered by the other

departments other than the parent department. Elective course means a specialized course, in sixth semester, from the frontier area of core subject. It is offered by the Parent Department which he/she is free to choose

Audit Courses

Courses which students can register without earning credits (Zero credit course) and are not compulsory for completing the degree programme.

Repeat Course

Repeat Course is a course that a student repeats if he/she has failed in it. Repeat courses are possible with the next batch for failed candidates.

Credit

Credit of a course measure of weekly unit of work involving lecture or laboratory session or seminar or similar activity designed for the course. Each credit hour is roughly equivalent to one hour of class time per week in a semester.

Grade

'Grade' indicates the level of performance of a student in a Course.

Grade Point

It is an integer indicating the numerical equivalent of the broad level of performance of a student in a Course. The product of Grade Point and the Credit of a Course is called 'Credit Point'.

Semester Credit Point Average (SCPA)

SCPA is an index of the overall performance of a student at the end of a semester. It is obtained by dividing the sum of the Credit Points obtained by a student at the end of a semester by the sum of the Credits of Courses taken by the student in the semester.

Cumulative Credit Point Average (CCPA)

CCPA indicates the broad academic level of performance of the student in a Programme. It is obtained by dividing the sum of the Credit Points in all the Courses taken by the student for theentire Programme by the total number of Credits

Evaluation and Grading

The Evaluation of each Course shall consists of two parts such as Continuous Evaluation/Assessment (CE/CA) andEnd Semester Evaluation/Assessment(ESE/ESA). There shall be a maximum of 80 marks for ESE and maximum of 20 marks for CE for UG Courses and 75 for ESA and 25 marks for CA for PG courses.

CONTINUOUS EVALUATION (CE) END SEMESTER EVALUATION/ASSESSMENT (ESE/ESA)

End Semester Evaluation of all the Courses in all the semesters shall be conducted by the University. The results of the ESE are to be published according to the Examination Calendar prescribed by the University Level Monitoring Committee (ULMC), which shall not exceed 45 days from the last day of the examination.

COLLEGE RULES AND POLICIESGeneral Discipline

The College expects the students to maintain high standards of discipline, ideal behaviour and dress codes to keep up the reputation of our institution. The following guidelines are prepared for strict observation.

- 1. Students are expected to maintain the best standards of behaviour in and out of the College.
- 2. Students are expected to wear clean and decent dress.
- 3. Students shall stand up when the teacher enters the class and resume seat with his/her permission.
- 4. No student shall enter and leave the class without the permission of the teacher.
- 5. Students are strictly prohibited from loitering on the veranda and corridors during working hours.
- 6. Students shall remain in the library/waiting room during free hours and utilize the time meaningfully.
- 7. Students shall handle the College properties with care and keep the surroundings clean and healthy.
- 8. Students shall not disfigure College wall, furniture, etc. with writing or engravings. Those indulging in such activities shall be fined.
- 9. Tobacco of any kind and pan are strictly prohibited in the campus. "Keep the campus tobacco free".

- 10. Keeping and using alcohol or drugs of any kind in the campus shall be an offence and offenders shall be seriously dealt with.
- 11. Complaints, if any, may be lodged in writing through proper channel.
- 12. Irregular attendance, insubordination to teachers, nonteaching staff and College authorities, and obscenity in word or deed shall be seriously dealt with.
- 13. Students are advised to pay attention to the notifications appearing on the notice board from time to time so that they may be well informed about the day-to- day affairs of the college. Urgent announcements will be made over the public address system.
- 14. Students are expected to maintain their classrooms clean.
- 15. Smoking, chewing, snuffing and other unpleasant practices are strictly prohibited.
- 16. Students shall wear neck band id cards when enter the college premises.
- 17. College premises is declared as a Plastic free zone. Hence students and staff should not litter the campus with plastics. Students and staff should bring their lunch in lunch boxes.

ATTENDANCE

- 1. Attendance is taken at the beginning of each period.
- 2. Students shall be in their seats at the beginning of each class. They are not allowed to leave their class rooms without the permission of the teacher.

- 3. Students are not permitted to absent themselves from classes without leave. Leave applications endorsed by the parent shall be submitted to the Principal duly recommended by the Group tutor and Head of the Department.
- 4. Absence during a period shall be treated as absence from a session either forenoon or afternoon, and absence for two periods from two sessions as absence for the whole day.
- 5. Leave on health grounds shall be supported by medical certificate.
- 6. Absence of a student without leave for more than 15 consecutive working days shall entail removal of his/her name from the rolls.
- 7. Statements of monthly / termly attendance will be published and intimated to parent / guardian. Complaints, if any, on the part of the student may be submitted to the Principal in writing.
- 8. Those who refrain from test-papers / Terminal Examinations shall be liable to disciplinary actions.
- 9. 75% attendance is mandatory to be presentd for University Examinations

PROHIBITION OF POLITICAL ACTIVITY

All types of student political activities are strictly prohibited in the College Campus as per the order of Honourable High Court of Kerala. To give effect to this the Management has decided to ban forth with all political activities in the campus. No student shall get involved in any political activity by him or/her or abet the said activity to be carried on by fellow students inside the campus in any manner whatsoever and any such activity is banned in the campus. Taking part in any political activity inside the campus for the purpose of doing any activities as defined by law shall constitute serious indiscipline. Every member of such gathering shall be individually liable and responsible for the gross indiscipline in this regard and the Principal shall have the power to take disciplinary action against those who violate these provisions. It shall constitute gross indiscipline to all for an appeal to strike based on policies and ideologies that may be preached by the Political Parties to their student organizations. The participants in the strike shall be dealt with by the disciplinary authority and they shall be imposed with appropriate punishment as mentioned in these rules. No student shall stage or indulge in any activity like Dharna, Gherao, and obstructing entry to and from any class room, office hall or other places inside the campus and such activities shall be treated as misconduct. No student shall shout slogans inside the class rooms, office or any other place inside the campus and obstruct and interfere or cause disturbance and nuisance to the ordinary functioning of the institution. Students shall not organize or attend meetings other than official ones in the College Campus. Students are prohibited from organizing and attending meeting in the College, distributing/circulating unauthorized notices or appeal of any kind or collecting money for any purpose without the written permission of the Principal. Nobody except the Principal is allowed to paste notices/stick bills on the College Notice Board. Any violation in this regard will attract disciplinary action under the provisions of contempt of Court.

PROHIBITION OF RAGGING

Ragging is prohibited inside and outside the institution as per the UGC Anti-Ragging Regulations. According to Section 2(B) of the Act, ragging is meant to be any physical or mental torture or any disorderly conduct towards any student of an educational institution causing apprehension, dread, humiliation or agitation in him/her. It can be any harassment like insulting, teasing, bullying or manhandling. It can also be forcing upon him/her to do something which he/she voluntarily won t dare to do normally.

RAGGING IS A CRIME

Ragging is a punishable offence. Any student involved in ragging/persuades other for ragging or advocates ragging either inside or outside an educational institution shall be subjected to a punishment of not more than 2 years imprisonment in addition to a penalty of Rs.10000/-. A student who is punished for ragging is liable to be dismissed from the institution and is barred from being admitted to any other institution for a period of 3 years from the date of issue of his dismissal order.

Complaint Against Ragging

If a student/parent/guardian or any staff of the College forwards a written complaint to the Principal, he/she has to make an urgent enquiry into the matter within one days of the receipt of such complaint. If the allegation is proved to be correct, the accused must be suspended with immediate effect and the matter must be referred to the police for further proceedings. If a written complaint is received by the Principal, he/she has to make a detailed enquiry and if it is found baseless, the complainant must be informed of in writing. For details Contact

PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION (PTA)

An association of parents and teachers has been organised on 19/08/1979 with a view to improve the discipline, progress and the successful functioning of the college and to bring in complete liaison with teachers and the taught and the parents and guardians. All guardians and teachers will be members of the Association. The Principal of the college is the President and Dr. SUSHMA RAJ R.V. (Dept. of Botany) is the PTA Secretary and Mr. VISHNU P. S. (Dept. of Economics) is the Treasurer. An executive committee is elected from the General Body of teachers and guardians comprising of 4 teachers and 4 parents.

Each Department convenes class-wise parent-teacher meetings twice a year to exchange views on students performances, their weaknesses and strengths. Such meetings improve the general performance of the Departments and the college. The PTA is very active in the college. It attempts to earnestly resolve the shortcomings of the institution. The PTA executive periodically meets to assess its function, and proposes the developmental activities to be carried out in the campus. Annual general body meetings are held in March every year, and the executive body is also elected as per the rules. Cash awards are given to the students who pass the final year B.A. /B.Sc. / B.Com./ P.G. examination from the college securing the highest marks in each of the main subjects of study, who excel in Sports and Arts by the PTA.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE FOR FIRST DEGREE PROGRAMME (FDP)

How to apply

Any candidate who wish to join First Degree Programme under Kerala University should compulsorily register online *http://admissions.kerala university.ac.in*. A candidate will have the facility to apply for various Programmes and colleges through a single registration.

Management Quota

For getting admission in management quota, candidates should submit separate applications in addition to online registration. Application can be had from the college office.

Sports Quota

At least one seat shall be reserved for sports candidates in each subject for the First Degree Programme. In addition to these seats, two additional seats, over and above the sanctioned strength, shall be created for allotment exclusively for sports candidates in FDP in each Arts and Commerce subjects. In postgraduate level, one seat is reserved for each subject.

Candidates who get allotment will have to report before the Principal concerned for admission on the dates notified by the University, with all documents listed by the same.

ADMISSION RULES

- 1. Generally students are admitted to the various courses only at the beginning of the academic year.
- 2. Any candidate found to have obtained admission by false representation, shall be summarily dismissed.
- 3. Ordinary TC will be issued only on the completion of the course. A student applying for TC will be required to clear his/her dues to the college.
- 4. Late fee will be charged if a student applies for TC, one year after the completion of his/her course.
- 5. Duplicate TC will be issued only on production of an affidavict (Stamped Paper) signed by a judicial first class Magistrate. Fee will be charged for the duplicate TC (Rs.200/-)

RULES REGARDING THE PAYMENT OF FEES

As per G.O. MS 40 95/74 H.Edu. dated 12-6-1974, the first installment of tuition fee and special fees from students of senior classes should be collected within a period of seven consecutive working days, beginning from the date of re- opening of the College. In the case of students of junior classes, the first installment of tuition fees due till the date of admission with special fees and caution deposits should be paid on or before the 7th consecutive working day of the month concerned.

- 1. Tuition fee shall be collected from June to February of the academic year in three equal installments. However, the fee for a year can be submitted in lump sum with the first installment.
- 2. The miscellaneous fee prescribed shall be collected along with the first installment in June.
- 3. Subsequent installments shall be collected as notified on or before the seventh working day of June, October and December, on specified days, for each class.
- 4. If the specified day for fee collection is a holiday, fee due is collected on the next working day
- 5. A fine of Rs.10/- will be levied after the 10th day of the due date.
- 6. If the fee and fine due are not remitted within 15 days of the due date, the name of the defaulter will be put on the notice board.

- 7. The last chance to clear an installment of the fee shall be the date previous to the due date of the succeeding installment.
- 8. A defaulter shall not be allowed to attend another term without remitting the fee for the previous term.
- 9. A defaulter who does not clear all the dues by March (he / she) shall not be promoted to a higher class or presented for the University examination.
- 10. A student admitted for one term only will have to remit the tuition fee for that term and the miscellaneous fees in full at the time of admission.
- 11. The rules are subject to change or modification according to the Government/ University orders issued from time to time.
- 12. Fee shall be accepted only on stipulated dates for each class from 10.00 am. to 2.00 pm. in college office.

Re-Admission

With the special permission of the Principal, the student has to remit all the arrears of fees with fine. The re-admitted students will get the benefit of attendance only from the date of readmission. (Last opportunity is defined as the last working day previous to the date of the succeeding installment. For the last installment, the last opportunity is fixed as 5th March. Absence (with or without leave) from the college shall not be an excuse for nonpayment of fees on the due date).

REFUND OF CAUTION DEPOSIT

- 1. After the completion of the course, Caution Deposit shall be refunded on receipt of application in the prescribed form from the student
- 2. All claims for refund shall be preferred on or before 31 March of the academic year in which the course is completed. The last date for the refund of the caution deposit shall be notified annually in important Malayalam dailies. If a student does not request for refund within two months of the notification, the whole amount shall be permanently forfeited and remitted to the Government revenue.
- 3. Caution deposit is refunded only on production of the fee receipts and the identity card.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT

Kerala has high female literacy rate, high enrollment and low dropouts from schools, low infant mortality rate, high sex ratio, higher age at marriage, long life expectancy and low fertility for women. At the same time, violence against women has also been increasing. We have been witnessing violence of different types within the family, in public places, in work situations, while using public transportation and so on. It would appear as though women are no safer anywhere and they have to be always alert against harassment. The statistics show the extent of violence against women as per registered cases in Kerala.

Definition of Sexual Harassment

The Supreme Court judgment provides a definition of sexual harassment. According to this, sexual harassment includes any unwelcome sexually determined behaviour whether directly or by implication as:

- 1. Physical contact and advances
- 2. A demand or request for sexual favours
- 3. Sexually coloured remarks
- 4. Showing pornography
- 5. Any other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of sexual nature.

Sexual Harassment may include, but is not, limited to the following:

- Promises of preferential treatment or threats relating to work and student status.
- 2. Displaying, showing or communicating pornography, obscene letters, posters, cartoons, photographs, contraceptives.
- 3. Physical or verbal harassment or abuse.
- 4. Disparaging sexual remarks and gestures even in a jocular tone.
- 5. Unwelcome touching.

- 6. Harassment through telephone calls or E-mail, uninvited following, blackmailing in or outside the campus.
- 7. Suggesting or demanding sexual involvement accompanied by implied or explicit threats concerning one's academic evaluation, work status etc. This policy will be applicable to all allegations of sexual harassment, by a student against an employee or a co-student or employee against a third party, to have taken place within the campus. This definition will form part of the policy developed by the University of Kerala.

Sexual Harassment-Legal implications

A student guilty of sexual harassment, shall be liable for any of the following penalties:

- 1. Warning, reprimand or censur
- 2. Suspension from the College for a period up to one month.
- 3. Debarment from appearing for the final examination for a period up to 3 years.
- 4. Rustication from the College.

INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE (ICC)

The Sexual Harassment of Women at workplace Act, 2013 mandated the establishment of an Internal Complaints Committee to look into the issues of Sexual Harassment and Gender based violence in all the institutions. Accordingly the ICC is entrusted with the responsibility of inquiring into the complaints made by aggrieved women in a time bound manner and recommend penal consequences to the offender as per legal provisions. The Special Women Cell acts as a watch dog of ICC and ensures timely report of such incidences. It also organizes gender sensitization programmes in the campus.

STUDENT SUPPORT PROGRAMMES TUTORIAL SYSTEM

A well-organized tutorial system is run in the College which aims at extending individual attention to every student. Last hour of the 20th of every calendar month or the day before working day will be the tutorial hour. A group tutor looks after the affairs of the students of a class. Group tutors give counselling individually and monitors the academic performance of each student and evaluate his/her skills regularly. Through this system, the overall performance of each student is closely monitored and intimated to the parents.

SOCIAL SERVICES / EXTENSION ACTIVITIES NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

In order to inculcate national spirit and discipline among students, NCC army was started in our college from past 40 years. The college NCC comprises both Senior Division Cadets (Boys) and Senior Wing Cadets (girls). The college NCC Company holds number 160 which

comes under 4 Kerala Battalion of Kerala and Lakshadweep Directorate. The National Cadet Corps in India is a voluntary organization which recruits cadets from high schools, colleges and Universities all over India. The cadets are given basic military training in small arms and parades. The officers and cadets have no liability for active military service once they complete their course but are given preference over normal candidates during selection based on the achievements in the corps. INFRASTRUCTURE AND STUDENT AMENITIES LIBRARY

Vision

The College Library is focused on a wide-running vision of keeping the library users of the College aware with the most recent improvements in different subject fields and to satisfy their Information needs which would sharpen the inventive and exploring ability of the College academic community.

VTM NSS College Central Library was started in 1964, which was initially in the room of present computer lab just opposite to the Principal's office. "Everyman's English Pronouncing Dictionary" written by Daniel Jones was the first book purchased for the Library. The Dewey Decimal Classification system, a standard systems of library classification by which library resources are arranged and ordered systematically. The collection of Library hold about 39508 volumes including text books, reference books and maps. We subscribe N-LIST, a college component of e-ShodhSindhu consortium with access to 6,000+ journals, 1,99,500+ ebooks under N-LIST and 6,00,000 ebooks through NDL.

The books have been catalogued and classified subject wise. There are separate sections of various departments. The library also has reference books. In order to facilitate borrowing of books, Computer Assisted Catalogue Facility is also provided. The library, the Computer Laboratory and the various Departments are linked through networking.

Regulations regarding the Reference Library

Books of reference are valuable and rare books form the Reference section of the Library. These books are not lent out to students, but the students may be permitted to make use of these volumes in the reading room.

Regulations regarding the General Library

1. The General Library will be kept open from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm on all working days

- 2. Students of the PG classes are permitted to borrow five books at a time, Final year degree students can borrow two books, and first and second year students are allowed only only one book at a time.
- 3. Students should produce Library card to borrow a book. The card is to be deposited with the librarian on borrowing a book and will be given back when the book is returned.
- 4. Books borrowed by the students shall not be retained for more than 14 days from the date of issue. If the due date falls on a holiday, the book must be returned on the next working day. Books borrowed before the commencement of vacation must be returned not later than the third working day after the reopening of the college.
- 5. Any book may be recalled at any time even if the period of loan has not expired.
- 6. Failure to return the book on the due date entails a fine of Re.1/- per day of delay for each book.
- 7. Failure to pay the Library fine due to the failure to return the book within the due by a student entails loss of privilege to borrow more books from the library till the overdue books are returned and dues cleared
- 8. The Librarian shall send the Principal every month a list of the students who have incurred library fine during the month together with a statement of books overdue from the students for necessary action
- 9. The marking of books with ink or pencil, spoiling or damaging, underlining of passages, writing of remarks etc. on the leaves of books or on illustrations, tearing of pages, pictures etc. are punishable.
- 10. If any book is lost, damaged or mutilated, the borrower would be required to replace the book with fine or pay such compensation as may be fixed by the Principal.
- 11. If a book belonging to a set or series is lost/damaged and a new volume is not available, the borrower shall be required to replace the whole set or series. The defaced and damaged book set or series will be given to the borrower after its replacement.
- 12. Before leaving the counter borrowers shall examine the books taken by them and point out any mutilation or defect in any books to the librarian and have these defects etc. noted in the book and initialled by him/her. Otherwise the borrower will be held responsible for any damage or mutilation observed.
- 13. It shall be the duty of the librarian and his/her staff to examine the books returned by the borrowers and take immediate action in all cases of mutilation or damage.
- 14. The transfer or sub-lending of books is strictly prohibited.

RESEARCH FACILITY

Department of Physics

The department of Physics provides high end research facilities to research scholars and MSc students for the execution of their project work in various fields of Scientific relevance. Our trust areas include recent research fields of materials science and study of aerosol properties. A material research laboratory was established with a grand in aid received from financial aid from Science & Engineering Research Board (SERB), Department of Science and Technology, Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of India under the scheme Fast Track Scheme for Young Scientists (SR/FTP/PS-070/2010). The laboratory processes advanced instruments for synthesis and processing of materials suited for photoluminescence and dielectric application.

The details of the facility are given below.

- (1) Precision Weighing balance- ensuring stoichiometric weight of raw materials
- (2) High temperature Electric Furnace Calcination and sintering studies (1500 °C)
- (3) Rotary ball mill for grinding and mixing the raw materials.
- (4) Fume cupboard- for nanoparticle synthesis through self-propagation solution combustion technique.
- (5) Hydraulic hand press- for compacting the powders to desired shape before sintering and other associated facilities required for synthesis.

For dielectric characterization of prepared samples, the research lab has an Hioki LCR Meter that can measure dielectric properties in the range 50 Hz to 5 MHz.

Atmospheric aerosols are particles suspended in the atmosphere. They are pollutants and have high health impacts. Apart from that they influence the climate and the earth's energy budget directly by scattering and absorbing solar radiation and indirectly by changing the cloud properties. According to IPCC (The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, a United Nations body), the effect of aerosol on global environment, air pollution and climate is poorly understood. Lack of

availability of scientific instrumentation at affordable cost is the primary reason for this low level of scientific understanding of the optical properties of these particulate matter in the atmosphere. Thus. characterizing the optical properties of aerosol has globally become an important topic of research in recent times. Our climate prediction capabilities are limited by uncertainties in the understanding of aerosol optical properties in addition to other properties like composition and mixing state, particle size, chemical property and loading (amount of emissions to the atmosphere and thereby polluting the environment). Reducing specific uncertainties such as the wavelength dependence of scattering and absorption by aerosols and development of appropriate. real time in situ measurement methodologies can lead to refined comprehension of aerosol climate effects. Department of Physics, VTM NSS College is equipped with High Sensitivity Spectrometer, Laser Driven Light Source (LDLS) and optical filters of various frequency range which are purchased under the KSCSTE SRS project. These instruments can be used to observe optical properties of aerosols.

SPORTS FACILITY

Department of Physical Education provides ample opportunity for the students to participate in sports and games. Select disciplines are prioritised to obtain the best performance in the University level competitions. Coaching camps are held prior to the participation in the University and Intercollegiate tournaments. In order to meet the fitness requirements and recreation of students, facilities such as gymnasium, play fields and various equipment are made available to them.

Sports quota seats are also reserved for the outstanding sportspersons as prescribed by the University, for both undergraduate and post graduate courses. Presently three seats are reserved in both Humanities and Commerce. For Science courses, one seat is reserved for sports. As for PG courses are concerned, one seat is reserved for all programmes.

Grace marks are awarded to those securing positions in various competitions. The percentage of grace marks varies from 2% to 255 based on the achievements at various levels of competitions.
