


VTM NSS College, Dhanuvachapuram Affiliated to the University of Kerala Re-accredited by NAAC at B+ Level

Bilingual Literary Fest 2021

experience to them and in maintaining justice to its theme of survival







In the first session of the second day of the fest






honour.


