CURRICULAR AND TEACHING-LEARNING ASPECTS



- The evaluation report indicates a well-conceived, adopted and implemented Outcome Based Education (OBE) through a moderately flexible CBCSS across all UG programmes and PG programmes.
- The CBCSS curriculum framework for all programs has included several scopes of learning through Core, Complementary and Language Courses; Open Courses, Elective Courses and Add-On Courses.
- The syllabus has been revised in the year 2018, 2019 and 2020 as per the directions of Board of Studies, University of Kerala.
- Value-Added and Add-on Courses have been included to cater to the needs of the students. 2018-19: 9 Add-on and Value-Added Courses 2019-20:7 Add-on and Value-Added Courses
- The college facilitates student-centric learning with initiatives such as remedial coaching, peer teaching, quiz programs, research methodology courses etc.
- Feedback on curriculum, teaching and infrastructure is taken annually from students, parents and alumni.
- The performance of faculty is assessed by the Principal and the IQAC through evaluation by the students and self-appraisal.
- The teaching-learning pedagogy involves experiential learning such as projects, assignments and group discussions.
- ICT enabled teaching pedagogy is meticulously followed.
- Regular monitoring of syllabus completion and its fair delivery was done.

# EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION SYSTEM

- ❖ False numbering system is implemented for transparency and confidentiality of examinations.
- External (80%) and Internal (20%) comprise the final marks.
- ❖ The final exams are conducted and valued as per regulations and instructions by University of Kerala.

Internal exams are conducted in a centralized way, valued on time and results published. Students are given appropriate chance to scrutinize the valuation as well as appear for improvement/ supplementary exam.

#### RESEARCH PROMOTION AND DEVELOPMENT

- All UG students prepare a project/research report under the guidance of faculty advisor.
- PG students of four PG departments (English, History, Economics, Commerce) conduct research projects under the guidance of faculty advisors.
- The college has 8 research guides.
- 33 Research papers have been published during the academic year 2018-19 and 2019-20.
- 2 Major and 1 Minor Research Projects have been awarded by KSCSTE worth 8,92750 lakhs during the tenure.
- The college has conducted consultancy and has mobilized fund through it during the tenure

- Lack of hostel for students

> Apply for funds from various State and Central schemes to improve infrastructure and teaching facilities.
